In our Phonics lessons, the class successfully completed reading group books, exploring exciting stories and expanding their literacy skills. I'm thrilled to inform parents that each K5 student received a Summer Learning Packet, providing 50 days of review activities to help them stay sharp for First Grade. This packet includes one page each of phonics, reading, and math review. Consistent practice over the summer will ensure that your child enters the next grade with confidence and readiness.







In our math curriculum, the students made significant strides in numerical understanding. They learned to count by 2's, laying a solid foundation for future concepts like multiplication. Additionally, in May, we wrapped up our focus on addition math facts 0-10 and introduced subtraction facts, starting with minus 0 and 1. These skills are essential building blocks for mathematical proficiency, and I encourage you to continue practicing them at home.

We also completed our Science curriculum, and the students had an incredible experience planting seeds and watching them grow. Each day, we watered the seeds, and over three weeks, the students observed as the seeds sprouted. Their eyes were filled with wonder. Before school ended, they took home their seedlings, and we encouraged them to plant them at home.

FIRST GRADE

Our First Grade continued to work on scripture memorization. Their Bible study focused on Jesus' specific directions to his disciples about how they were to spread the gospel: first in their local Jerusalem, then to Judea, then Samaria, and finally to the ends of the earth. The Bible study concluded with Paul's First Missionary Journey and the spreading of the gospel "to the ends of the earth."

They also learned that their job is the same as the disciples'. They can be little missionaries wherever they are. Whether at home, in their neighborhood, on their soccer team, or even in the grocery store, they can share their verses, Bible songs, and Bible stories with others.

First Graders had fun reading advanced readers about Science, Health, and History. As they read about metamorphosis, the class raised tadpoles and caterpillars. They also made an ant farm and watched God's plan for the worker ants to create tunnels and carry food.

In Arithmetic, the class was introduced to multiplication, adding and subtracting three-digit numbers, and counting paper money as well as coins. They also worked with fractions and found 1/3, 1/4, and 1/2 of a group of animals.

They continued to write amazing stories, which were sometimes two or three pages long.

Altogether, they are showing how ready they are for next year and Second Grade!
